#### RECIPE STRAWBERRY SALAD

#### **INGREDIENTS:**

For the Salad:

5-7 ounces Spring Mix

½ red onion, thinly sliced

2 ripe Avocados, peeled, seeded and diced

1 quart strawberries, stems removed and quartered

#### For the Dressing:

1/3 cup extra virgin olive oil

2 tbsp. white balsamic vinegar, or vinegar of choice

2 tbsp. honey

1 tsp. mustard

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. freshly ground black pepper

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

1. In a large mixing bowl, combine Spring mix, onion, avocado, strawberries.

2. In a medium bowl or measuring cup, whisk together the olive oil, balsamic vinegar, honey, mustard, salt, and pepper until emulsified.

Note: If desired, blend all of the dressing ingredients mentioned above for ultimate creaminess.

3. Pour the dressing overtop and gently toss.

4. Enjoy!
